Kim has been deeply and passionately involved in sport development in the area of track and field for over 45 years.

- Began coaching with Richmond Kajaks Track & Field club which he helped establish in mid-1960's
- Past President of BC Athletics (BC Track & Field Association – at the time).
- Past Director of Athletics Canada (formerly the Canadian Track & Field Association).
- Contributing Author to the Premier Sport Awards Program.
- Coach of Provincial and Canadian international athletes – Tinker Robinson, Donna Barker, Heather Donaldson, Lori Ewing, and Olympians – Marjorie Bailey, Anne Mackie-Morelli, and Albin Dukowski.
- Canadian National Team Coach – Pan Pacific Games 1979, 1981; Head Coach Canada vs East Germany's national team in 1983.
- Member of the BC Athletics Senior Track & Field Committee during the 1970's and early 80's and a leader in setting a philosophy for the selection of BC teams.
- Member and Vice President of the Achilles International Track & Field Society and Chair of the Harry Jerome International Track Classic Meet Management Committee.
- Inducted into the B.C. Athletics Hall of Fame, 2008.

Kim earned a B.Ed. at UBC and a M.Ed. at Western Washington University. He worked in two school districts, dividing his 34 years in public education equally between Richmond (as teacher, Vice Principal, Principal, and Director) and in Delta (Assistant Superintendent). He also served for three years as a regional coordinator for the Ministry's Field Services Division – working with school districts to implement Ministry of Education learning initiatives -- a professional relationship that extended beyond his retirement from Delta in 2000. After his retirement from full-time service, his involvement in education has continued in the ongoing capacity of Professional Development Coordinator for the BC School Superintendents Association.
